





Supply List, Colored Pencil on Drafting Film

Colored Pencils: due to my belief that Faber-Castell Polychromos pencils are a bit easier to control on drafting film, I am listing them as my preferred brand. However, I have also listed Prismacolor Premier substitutes if that is what you own and prefer to just work with them. However, regardless what you use, I DO recommend a Prismacolor Premier Canary Yellow 916 for finishing work.

Graphite pencil: #2 or HB or similar; mechanical pencil also works well

Sheet of plain white drawing paper, any type: this will just be used to slide under your drafting film at times to make some things easier to see.

Clear blending pencil: my preferred type is the Caran d'Ache Full Blender; a close runner-up is the Lyra Splender, but other brands will do.

Paper blending stump: any size that is comfortable to hold. The compressed paper type is double-ended to give you more options and is a bit sturdier than the rolled paper type (tortillon). One is adequate but sometimes students like to have more than one since they wear out rather quickly.

Small piece of sandpaper: for cleaning the blending stump(s)

Removable mounting putty (AKA poster putty, sticky tack, etc.): an excellent brand is Alcolin Sticky Putty, available from Amazon

White plastic eraser in a pen-type holder: General's Factis BM2 is a good, 1/8" diameter version; Tombow's Mono Zero comes in a 1/16" cylindrical version and a 1/16" x ¼" rectangular version. All give excellent control.

Pencil sharpener that will give a VERY sharp point.

Small sheet of regular household wax paper.

Drafting or other soft brush to remove pencil and eraser crumbs.

Piece of copier paper or tracing paper (or more wax paper), etc., to use as a slip sheet to protect your drawing.
