Supply list and Lesson Plan Character Design Workshop

Supplies

- •9x12 multi or all-purpose drawing pad
- •graphite pencils (mechanical or not)
- •A .01 and .05 drawing pen (such as Microns or fine point Sharpies)
- Tracing paper
- •Your cell phone (yes, your cell phone!)
- •Colored pencils and sharpener (Not everyone will end up using their pencils, but it is good to have them handy just in case.)

Day One - the character's head and face

- •Each student will learn how to create a character in their own style by following these 4 ideals when designing their character: Resonate, Exaggerate, Accentuate & Understate
- •Each student will "meet" their own character and learn how to get to know them personally enough to create their characters
- •Each student will create at least one head drawing of the character they met

Day Two - the character's body

- •We will go over using the same 4 ideals from day one to design the body: Resonate, Exaggerate, Accentuate & Understate
- Portraying emotion in body positions
- Create a complete character!
